TUC Congress 2025 • Ukraine Solidarity Campaign bulletin

2025 has seen further escalation of Russia's brutal imperialist war against Ukraine.

This summer, while Donald Trump rolled out the red carpet for indicted war criminal Vladimir Putin, Russia stepped up its assault on Ukrainian civilians. It's now common for Ukraine to face hundreds of missile and drones strikes a night. Attacks have doubled since Trump's return.

Alongside the tens of thousands of civilian casualties, creation of millions of refugees, destructions of cities and towns, deliberate targeting of workplaces, hospitals, schools and emergency services, the Russian army has now seen over a million casualties, including over two hundred thousand soldiers dead. Putin and his regime do not care.

Long-term, sustainable peace requires Ukraine defeating Russian imperialism. UK unions have rightly stood in solidarity with Ukraine. Now is the time to step up solidarity.

UK unions shift further towards Ukraine

Each of the four rounds of UK union conferences since Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine in February 2022 has seen strengthening of solidarity with Ukraine. This year:

- After three years of having solidarity motions blocked, **NEU** conference voted by a huge margin for a strong Ukraine solidarity motion, after rejecting "Stop the War" type wrecking amendments by a margin of 2-1.
- PCS maintained its stance of solidarity with Ukraine.
- **UCU** Congress which last year overturned its 2023 stance of opposing military aid for Ukraine, backed Ukraine's resistance and affiliated to USC remitted an attempt to link the "Welfare not warfare" policy it passed to opposing support for Ukraine.
- A Ukraine solidarity motion was submitted to **FBU** conference, the first time the union has had a Ukraine motion on the agenda (though it was not in the end heard).
- RMT AGM passed "Stop the War" type policy opposing military aid to Ukraine but only on the chair's casting vote, after delegates tied 27-27-10, showing the strength of opposition in the union.
- **Unite**'s biennial Policy Conference overwhelmingly passed a motion with concrete steps to put into action the practical solidarity with Ukrainian unions it agreed in 2023.

Organising is going on in a range of unions to put pro-Ukraine policy into action, while developing stronger practical links and solidarity at a branch and activist level. There are now organised solidarity networks in a number of unions, with more being discussed. Get in touch to get involved.

"Stop Russian terror, protect peace and justice" – joint appeal from five Ukrainian union federations

On the back of the leaflet advertising our TUC Congress fringe meeting, we have republished the appeal to trade unions globally for stepped up solidarity with Ukraine issued on 28 August by the Confederation of Free Trade Unions of Ukraine (KVPU).

We print here an extract of a statement issued in July by the KVPU together with Ukraine's other main union federation, FPU, and three smaller federations – FPTU, AATU and AATU 'Yednist'.

"At a time when thousands of our members are resisting and fighting against the Russian occupiers in the ranks of the Armed Forces of Ukraine, working under fire and staying up all night because of attacks, we urge trade union movement and the international community to act.

"We call on the ITUC, its member organisations, global union federations, all trade unionists, all defenders of human dignity and solidarity, to:

"Clearly and unequivocally condemn Russia's bombing of Ukrainian cities and killing of civilians. Share information about Ukraine on your informational resources

"Demand stronger economic, humanitarian, and military support for Ukraine from your governments

"Push for intensified sanctions against the aggressor state

"Call for prosecution of all those responsible for war crimes

"Demand the release of all Ukrainian prisoners of war and civilian hostages, and the immediate return of all abducted Ukrainian children

"Today, we fight not only for our country but for the values that unite the global trade union movement – decent work, the right to life, the right to safety, and the right to solidarity."

Demand an alternative to Russian occupation

Alongside UK unions, MPs, Ukrainian unions and activists and others, USC has launched a charter of demands on the UK government to break from Trump and help Ukraine win. You can read and sign, as an organisation or individual at bit.ly/helpukrainewin

"Wages Not Weapons" motion

Unions involved in Ukraine Solidarity Campaign will take different positions on the "Wages Not Weapons" motion (motion 37) put to Congress by UCU.

The Stop the War Coalition might like this to be a vote on Ukraine; but it is not. UCU has policy supporting the Ukrainian resistance to Russia and is affiliated to USC. At this year's UCU Congress, delegates passed policy for "Welfare not warfare" but voted to remit text linking this to Ukraine.

What is crucial is that the labour movement supports continued and stepped up aid to help Ukraine defeat the Russian invasion, which is also the way to avoid wider wars and wider militarisation in future. Military aid for Ukraine is only a small percentage of UK military spending; but higher military spending does not automatically mean more, let alone adequate, support for Ukraine.

Labour movement aid

Since the full-scale invasion, we have helped UK trade unions raise and deliver hundreds of thousands of pounds in practical aid for both Ukrainian front-line defenders and essential workers behind the lines (firefighters and rescue workers, health workers, education workers, miners and others).

In 2024-5 we raised tens of thousands in aid to support rescue workers in Donetsk oblast, in eastern Ukraine near the frontline (see bit.ly/supportukrainerescue). We are now fundraising to provide a pick-up truck for conversion and use by a rapid response battalion intercepting Russian missiles and drones to protect civilians in Sumy region, in north east Ukraine.
